## **Child Abuse Prevention Services Golf Outing Benefit on June 13th Will Honor Cablevision Sr. VP, Al Azralon**

The presentation will be made during the CAPS 13th Annual Golf Outing, Monday, June 13 at The Muttontown Club, East Norwich, and support the agency's new Bully Prevention Center.

"Al has been a true ambassador for CAPS," said Alane Fagin, Executive Director. "His most significant and ongoing contributions are creating awareness of our mission in the corporate community, and developing new philanthropic relationships. We applaud Al for his efforts both on our Board and in the community that ultimately serve toward improving the lives of children on Long Island."

Al was first introduced to CAPS, several years ago, through an invitation to play in this Golf Outing. Wanting to get involved, he became a member of the CAPS Board in 2006, and later took on the responsibility of chairing the Golf Committee. Under his three-year leadership, the event flourished.

Professionally, Al began his tenure at Cablevision in 1985, and in that time, has held numerous positions of increasing responsibility and played an integral role in introducing new technologies including new addressable technology, pay per view, the company's first digital platform, and technologies surrounding the Digital Home Gateway. In his current role as Senior Vice President, Technology Integration, he directs the efforts of the Corporate Engineering and Technology Department as they relate to the development and integration of Cablevision's advanced digital platform, which supports the company's next generation of digital services.

The Roslyn-based Child Abuse Prevention Services was founded in 1982. The CAPS Bully Prevention Center, opened last year, is the first of its kind to offer parents the direct support and resources they need to resolve bullying and cyber-bullying incidents involving their school-age child.
